Basis

- 1. In accordance with the "Regulations for Experimental Education in Senior High Schools" revised by the Ministry of Education, Order No. 1110139682A dated Oct 28, 2022.
- 2. Approved by the Taipei City Department of Education in letter No. 11430580071 dated April 30, 2025.
- 3. Filed by the Ministry of Education in letter No. 000000 dated 000, 2025.
- Enrollment Quota Admission for Grade 10 students (Year 1 of senior high school) with a total of 15 students; Admission for Grade 11 students (Year 1 of senior high school) with a total of 4 students.
- > **Eligibility** Applicants must meet one of the following criteria:
 - 1. Children of foreign professional talents whose parents qualify under Article 4 of the *Act for the Recruitment and Employment of Foreign Professionals*. This includes:
 - (1) **Foreign professional talents:** Foreign nationals permitted to engage in professional work in Taiwan.
 - (2) **Foreign special professional talents:** Foreign professional talents who possess specialized expertise in fields such as technology, economy, education, culture, arts, sports, finance, law, architectural design, national defense, or other areas designated as necessary by the central competent authority. This includes those recognized by the authority upon consultation with relevant government agencies.
 - (3) **Foreign senior professional talents:** High-level professionals required by Taiwan, as defined in Article 25, Paragraph 3, and Subparagraph 2 of the *Immigration Act*. (https://reurl.cc/p97NZa)
 - (4) Scope of professional work:
 - A. Occupations defined in Article 46, Paragraph 1, and Subparagraphs 1 to 3, 5, and 6 of the *Employment Services Act*. (<u>https://reurl.cc/eGq2Wj</u>)
 - B. Occupations defined in Article 48, Paragraph 1, Subparagraphs 1 and 3 of the *Employment Services Act*.

- C. Non-language subject teachers approved by the Ministry of Education to teach children of foreign professional talents in designated school programs.
- D. Professionals engaged in academic subject teaching, foreign language instruction, teacher training, curriculum development, and activity promotion, as stipulated under the *Act Governing School-based Experimental Education* and related regulations.
- 2. Children of outstanding overseas science and technology talents who meet the qualifications specified in the *Regulations Governing Education for Children of Outstanding Overseas Science and Technology Talent*. (https://reurl.cc/yD28Y2)
- 3. Students enrolled in bilingual or language education programs under the transition curriculum plan established by public junior high schools, as part of the Ministry of *Education's Comprehensive Implementation Plan for Overseas Talent Recruitment Education Support.* Their parents must also meet one of the above conditions.

> Application Processe

- 1. **Dates and Time:** Monday, May 26, 2025 to Friday, June 27, 2025 (the application period may be extended based on the number of applicants, and updates will be posted on the school's website).
- 2. **Application Process and Required Documents:** Applications will be submitted online through the following link: <u>https://reurl.cc/Q50kQ5</u>
 - (1) According to Article 3 of the "Regulations for Experimental Education in Senior High Schools": "The school shall obtain the consent of the student and their parents or guardians before conducting experiments." Therefore, applicants and their parents must read and sign the Consent Form for Participation in Experimental Education (Appendix 3) and upload it to the application form. If admitted, two signed originals must be submitted upon registration.
 - (2) Applicants who meet the qualifications and submit complete documentation will pass the first stage of review. Those selected will proceed to a parent interview and student assessment, where 30 candidates will be chosen based on merit.
- 3. **Required Documents** (refer to Appendix 1 Self-checklist):
 - (1) The following documents must be attached:
 - A. Completed application form (Appendix 2) scanned and uploaded (including a recent 2-inch, hatless, half-body photo of the student); originals must be submitted during registration.

 - D. Parent's (guardian's) residence permit, work permit, and passport.
 - E. Proof of the parent-child relationship.

> Enrollment

> Graduation Requirements

- 1. A total of 180 credits must be completed, with a minimum of 150 credits earned and passed to graduate.
- 2. The student must have no more than three major demerits after accounting for any disciplinary actions during the study period.

> Counseling and Placement

- 1. Life Counseling:
 - (1) The homeroom teacher is responsible for providing appropriate guidance and will collaborate with other counselors to offer either class-based or individual guidance.
 - (2) One to two times per semester, the homeroom teacher, subject teachers, and staff from the Office of Research and Development, Counseling Office, Academic Affairs Office, and Student Affairs Office will hold regular case discussions to develop and adjust counseling strategies and actions.
- 2. Learning Counseling:
 - (1) Subject teachers will provide class-based or individual counseling as needed.
 - (2) A **Parent-Teacher Forum** for the "Overseas Talent Recruitment Class" will be held, alongside **Teaching and Life Counseling Discussions**.

 - (1) Freshmen will have one career counseling class per week, with guidance provided by the career counselor.

 - (3) Tailored assistance will be provided for students intending to continue their studies in Taiwan or pursue higher education abroad.

(4) Regular follow-up will be conducted to track the employment or academic progress of graduates.

International Class at Yangming High School

Course Architecture

The "International Class" will be taught bilingually in both English and Chinese (except for Chinese and English language courses) and will follow CLIL (Content and Language Integrated Learning) curriculum guidelines. Each CLIL course will follow the four fundamentals of the CLIL curriculum as outlined in the European framework: content, communication, cognition, and culture. These four C's are paramount to the acquisition of knowledge and for facilitating critical learning skills across languages.

This "International Class" program will start from the 112 academic year and last until the 114 academic year, which means that the bilingual courses will cover student learning from their first year (111) to their completion of High School in year 113.

The following outlines the course map for the International Class at Yangming High School

- 1. Ministry-mandated required courses: English, Math, and Physical Education are required courses. The subject English is instructed only in English. Math is instructed by bilingual teachers, and Physical Education is taught in Chinese. Foreign teachers will collaborate with the instructors according to the learning situations of students.
- 2. Intercultural Communication courses : These courses are for students to recognize the history of the campus as well as the culture and ethos of the school. These classes include School Activities, Class Meetings, and an Elective Club.
- 3. Academic-development courses (required) : Research Methods and Miscellaneous Academic Topic Exploration" are required courses at our school. These courses take two full years to complete. Students in the international class will be required to complete one full research paper as well as a presentation entirely in English.
- 4. Elective subjects: For electives, students will be allowed to choose from the following courses: Mandarin Chinese, Social Sciences (which includes History, Geography, and Civics and Society), Science (which includes Physics, Chemistry, Biology, and Earth Science), Inquiry and Application of Natural Sciences, Arts and Life Sciences (which includes Music, Arts and Life, and Home Economics)" and Information Technology (which includes Computer Science and Living Technology). We cooperate with the Department of Chinese as a Second Language in universities and recruit their teachers to lecture Mandarin Chinese with the collaboration of foreign English teachers. Arts and Life and Information Technology are domain-specific courses on the curriculum guidelines taught in Chinese. Civics and Society is inquiry-based, and mainly focuses on SDGs issues; some units on international affairs are taught in Mandarin Chinese and English. The rest of the subjects are taught in Mandarin Chinese and English. Instructors of elective courses are able to collaborate with foreign teachers according to the learning situations of students.
- 5. Individualized Curriculum : Students can arrange their own course map based on their pick of the modular courses offered. This way, students can tailor their courses to their individual learning needs.
 - (1) The courses that are elective and can be picked from include: Academic Research, Multiple Skills, Entrepreneurship, Test prep, SAT prep, preparation for studying aboard, and many more.
 - (2) Students can select courses after they appear in the online course selection system, however, we cannot guarantee a spot in the class since class sizes and offerings are limited. Unfortunately, that means course selection is on a "first come, first serve" basis and once the class fills up, we can't allow any additional students past the limit. At the end of each semester, we will distribute and collect surveys from the student body and use these surveys to determine which elective courses will

be offered in the following year.

- (3) "Let students be their own master in learning" is our creed here at Yangming High School. In order for us to fulfill our mission, we encourage our students to embark on a journey of self-discovery in terms of academia. Students will be encouraged to think critically, use information learned in class to create new ideas, and synthesize and interpret information from across academic disciplines. We encourage our students to constantly ask questions. We also have a system to help our students choose classes at other schools for their individualized curriculum courses. This has been established according to a Taiwanese law called "Taipei City Senior High School's Students to other school take course and transference" wherein students may elect to choose courses to attend at other high schools around Taipei City. This option is not limited to Individualized Courses but can include any courses students want to attend.
- (4) All these courses (under the individualized course label) are optional and therefore include an extra charge for instruction that will cover, the hourly rate for the instructor, material fees, and expenses for renting equipment.



Courses' structure and academic credit

As a student in the International Class, the following are required subjects. Each semester in first and second grade there will be 17 academic credits. In the third grade, each semester will have 7 academic credits. In total you will get 82 academic credits over the course of three years.

Our school has a goal that we call the FIVE STARTS. These are self-development, teamwork, attention to society, international relations, and problem-solving. These required subjects are the basic academic foundation while elective subjects are intended as supplementary knowledge.

In our school we also offer clubs, alternative curriculum periods, and allow our students to choose the topics that they are interested in for their research. We have lots of events and activities to foster a strong community culture among the student body.
